CONFESSIO AND ABSOLUTION: (*drawn from Galatians 4 and 1 John*)

Pastor: Beloved in the Lord! We are sinners, undeserving of the holy Gift given us this day.

People: What you say is right. We have broken God’s righteous law in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We deserve from God neither mercy nor favor; our sinfulness should discredit us in His sight and disqualify us for heaven.

Pastor: Do not be afraid, my friends. God is rich in grace. His favor rests on you, for in the fullness of time He sent forth His Son, born in human flesh, to shed for us the blood that alone would secure our redemption, remove from us all guilt, and open heaven to us. Christ bore sin for us, suffered in full its condemnation, paid in full its wage of death, then rose victorious over it.

People: We are rescued from death by the death of Christ! His blood covers us and purifies us from sin.

Pastor: God in Christ has given you new and eternal life. For Jesus’ sake He welcomes you into His kingdom. Jesus’ manger is the Christian’s hope, His cross the

Christian's glory, and His crown the Christian's joy. These gifts are yours! They seal your salvation. As a called and ordained minister of this gospel and with the authority the risen and soon returning Lord has bestowed on His Church I declare to you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit that your sin is forgiven; peace with God is yours in Christ!

People: Amen.

SALUTATION AND COLLECT FOR CHRISTMAS DAY:

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Pastor: Let us pray.

People: Almighty God, by the yearly festival of the birth of Your only-begotten Son You gladden our hearts and lift our spirits. Grant that we who today joyfully welcome Jesus as our Redeemer may winsomely introduce others to Him as Savior and greet Him fearlessly when He comes to be our Judge; through Christ our Lord, Who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

CHRISTMAS PSALM: Psalm 98 (Chanted by Austin)

EPISTLE READING: *Titus 3:4-7*

When the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, He saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by His grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

Lector: Alleluia! Alleluia! Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts.

People: Sing to the Lord a new song, for He has done marvelous things! Alleluia!

Lector: Please rise, as you are able.

Lector: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 1st chapter:

People: Glory to You, O Lord!

GOSPEL READING: *John 1:1-18*

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him was not any thing made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, yet the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and His own people did not receive Him. But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. (John bore witness about Him, and cried out, "This was He of Whom I said, 'He Who comes after me ranks before me, because He was before me.'") And from His fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only God, Who is at the Father's side, He has made Him known.

Lector: This is the Gospel of our Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ!

Lector: We confess together our Christian faith, using the explanation of the second article of the Apostles' Creed, from Luther's Small Catechism.

CONFESSION OF FAITH:

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true Man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord, Who has redeemed me, a lost and

condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own, live under Him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives, and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.
