CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION:

PRAYERS OF THE CHURCH *(Responsory: Psalm 145:10)*

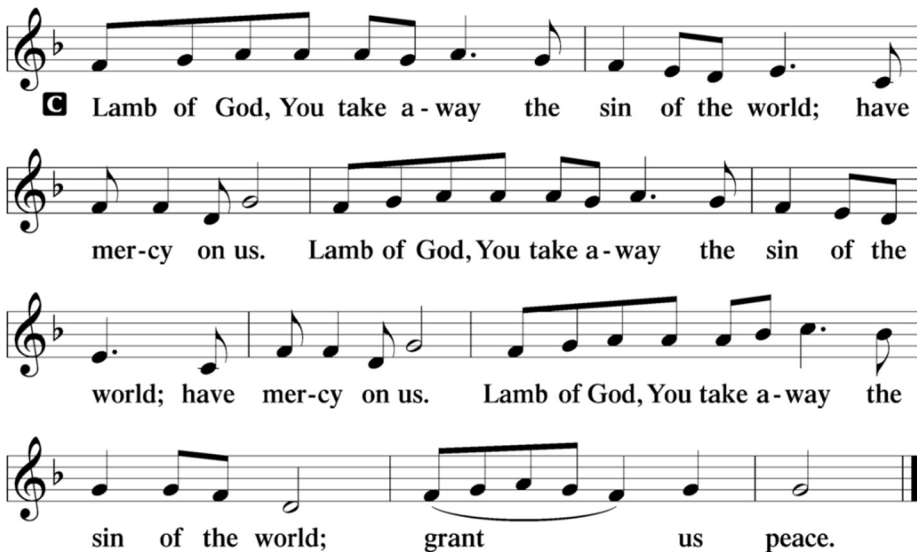
