CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION:

Pastor: "Amen" means "truth," dear ones; and it is surely true that Christ is worthy

From the things in ourselves that make for war and disunion:

People: Save us, we pray.

Pastor: For the coming of Christ to be the Savior of the world and the Prince of Peace,

for His teaching and example, His life and death and resurrection, and for the

miracle of His rule in human hearts:

People: We bless and praise Your glorious name.

Pastor: For the peace that passes understanding:

People: We bless and praise Your glorious name.

Pastor: That we may know and do the things that make for peace:

People: Give us Your grace, O God of our salvation.

Pastor: That we may love our enemies and learn to overcome evil with good:

People: Give us Your grace, You Who are kind to the unthankful and the evil.

Pastor: That we may imitate Your Son in sacrificing ourselves for the welfare of

others:

People: Give us Your grace, You in Whose sight every life is dear.

Pastor: That before the Day of Judgment all nations may know the Babe of

Bethlehem as Savior and Lord:

People: Work in us that our witness to Jesus will be bold and loving, constant,

joyful, and prayerful, for we ask this in His name. Amen.

EPISTLE READING: Romans 1:1-7

Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which He promised beforehand through His prophets in the holy Scriptures, concerning His Son, Who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by His resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, through Whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of His name among all the nations, including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ,

To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints:

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Lector: This is the word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Lector: Please rise, as you are able.

Lector: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 1st chapter:

People: Glory to You, O Lord!

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 1:18-25

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When His mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with Child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a Son, and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:

"Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son,

and they shall call His name Immanuel"

(which means, God with us). When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife, but knew her not until she had given birth to a Son. And he called His name Jesus.

Lector: This is the Gospel of our Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ!

Lector: We confess together our Christian faith, using the Apostles' Creed.

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen!


