THE OLD TESTAMENT READING: Deuteronomy 8:1-10

Be careful to follow every command I am giving you today, so that you may live and increase and may enter and possess the land that the LORD promised on oath to your forefathers. Remember how the LORD your God led you all the way in the desert these forty years, to humble you and to test you in order to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep His commands. He humbled you, causing you to hunger and then feeding you with manna, which neither you nor your fathers had known, to teach you that man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD. Your clothes did not wear out and your feet did not swell during these forty years. Know then in your heart that as a man disciplines his son, so the LORD your God disciplines you. Observe the commands of the LORD your God, walking in His ways and revering Him. For the LORD your God is bringing you into a good land—a land with streams and pools of water, with springs flowing in the valleys and hills; a land with wheat and barley, vines and fig trees, pomegranates, olive oil and honey; a land where bread will not be scarce and you will lack nothing; a land where the rocks are iron and

you can dig copper out of the hills. When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the LORD your God for the good land He has given you.

Lector: Sing to the LORD, all the earth; proclaim His salvation day after day.

People: Declare His glory among the nations, His marvelous deeds among all peoples.

Lector: For great is the LORD and most worthy of praise; He is to be feared above

all gods.

People: For all the gods of the nations are idols, but the LORD made the heavens.

Lector: Splendor and majesty are before Him;

People: strength and joy [are] in His dwelling place.

EPISTLE READING: Philippians 4:6-20

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable - if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me - put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.

I rejoice greatly in the Lord that at last you have renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you have been concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. I can do everything through Him Who gives me strength.

Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles. Moreover, as you Philippians know, in the early days of your acquaintance with the gospel, when I set out from Macedonia, not one church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving, except you only; for even when I was in Thessalonica, you sent me aid again and again when I was in need. Not that I am looking for a gift, but I am looking for what may be credited to your account. I have received full payment and even more; I am amply supplied, now that I have received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent. They are a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God. And my God will meet all your needs according to His glorious riches in Christ Jesus.

To our God and Father be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Lector: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 17th chapter:

GOSPEL READING: Luke 17:11-19

Now on His way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As He was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met Him. They stood at a distance and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!"

When He saw them, He said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.

One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked Him - and he was a Samaritan.

Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" Then He said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."

Lector: This is the Gospel of our Lord.

People: Praise to You, O Christ!

Lector: We confess together our Christian faith, using the Apostles' Creed.

CONFESSION OF FAITH: The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and the life everlasting. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE CHURCH and THE LORD'S PRAYER:

Your titles are many, God of goodness and enduring love, and each reveals holy truth, yet even the sum of them is insufficient. Who You are and What You are--Your glory and majesty, Your grace and mercy, Your power and dominion, Your wisdom and honor--exceed all bounds of human comprehension. We use words to address You and to describe what is indescribable because You reveal Yourself to us in the words of holy scripture. In Christ Jesus You made Your word to be flesh for us. We pray, Lord Jesus, for Your own grace of generosity. You withheld nothing for Yourself, but gave Yourself fully to death to rescue us from sin and hell. To the hungry You gave food, and to the ailing health; to the demon-possessed You gave freedom and to the dead new life. To nails and a cross You gave Your hands and feet that to

sinners You might give forgiveness. Grant us such selflessness, that on every occasion, whatever the need, we, too, will gladly give of ourselves for the blessing of others.

Father in heaven, Your Spirit has assembled us for worship this day, but within our fellowship, throughout our community, and across the globe there are many whose daily labors or conditions of life prevent them from joining us. We bless You for all who dutifully give up holidays to promote peace, support life, protect property, and maintain justice. We pray for those who are homebound, hospitalized, or incapacitated, and we ask You to keep their needs before us that we remember them in prayer and do whatever we can to comfort and sustain them. We ache, God of compassion, for those who enter this holiday season mourning the loss of loved ones. Grant them the comfort of Easter through the declaration of Your risen Son, "Because I live, you, too, will live."

God of peace, present with us in Jesus, the earth writhes in the pain of its fallenness. Natural disasters, moral decay, and political upheavals, threaten life and prosperity. Conflict rages across the globe, among nations, within families, and even in the Church that bears the name of Christ. The spiritual dangers of both great wealth and great poverty are amply evident; the tolls of pandemic and prejudice are undeniable; universal truths are not universally held; and the institutions that once undergirded the structures of societies are weakening. Exert Your strength, we pray. By the Gospel of Your Son's death and resurrection bring peace to all nations, our families, and the Church. Heal by Your grace the divisions, the fears, resentments, and jealousies that pit us against each other. By the forgiveness that flows from His wounds, bind us all to Christ and thus also to one another.

Spirit of God, work Your miracle of conversion near and far. Use us and the testimony You work in us to lead to Jesus those who do not yet know and love His name. Throughout this season and throughout our lives make the unbelieving the special focus of our prayers and attentions. Fill us with zeal for all Christian ministry that at the end of time, when Christ comes again, many will kneel in faith before Him and sing the song of the saved: "Worthy is the Lamb Who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and praise."

All this and whatsoever else You would have us raise before You in thanksgiving or lift in petition, we pray, holy God, through Jesus Christ, Who taught us to pray: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into

temptation; but deliver us from evil, for Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.
